A Message from the Vice President of Research & Technology

Dear Research Colleagues:

I would like to express my gratitude for your continued support toward the Center for the Clinical Research and Technology (CCRT) throughout 2008.

The mission of the CCRT is to provide infrastructure, programmatic and administrative support to University Hospitals as it relates to grants, protocols and the conduct of research to support UHCMC's mission To Heal. To Teach. To Discover. I am proud to share with you some of our achievements in 2008:

- The Grants and Contracts Pre-Award Office, which provides oversight of the legal & budgetary aspects of grants & contracts, collectively achieved a 14% increase in the number of executed research agreements.
- The Grants and Contracts Post-Award Office provides oversight of all fiscal aspects of grant management and the research expenditures grew by a total of 7% of the past year.
- The Office of Technology Management (OTM), which specializes in the utilization, creation, protection and commercialization of intellectual property, achieved a 13% increase in licensing and royalty revenue that was generated from institutional patents.
- The IRB Administration Office, which is responsible for ensuring that all research involving human subjects is conducted in accordance with Federal & State regulations as well as institutional policies reviewed 597 new protocols and UH had 2,080 active protocols, resulting in an increase of 2% in the number of protocols over the past year.
- The Office of Research Compliance and Education which offers regulatory monitoring support and research education to the UHCMC/Case research community monitored 25% more protocols and offered 53% more education sessions which were attended by 55% more research personnel.

Your interaction with our office is essential to our collective success. The diagram below illustrates the available resources that the CCRT offers to you and your staff.
