Electives outside of this list may be taken with GME and PD approval. **All elective rotations must be pre-approved by the rotation's preceptor as well as the Internal Medicine Residency Program Director.**

**All Residents must have successfully completed COMLEX or USMLE Step III and have completed the first draft of their scholarly activity in order to be advanced to PGY-3. There are two scholarly activity requirements, one of which must be a QI project.

Residents must review rotation specific curriculum on MedHub prior to the start of each rotation. This curriculum must be "confirmed" to document that the resident has reviewed the appropriate material.

In addition to scheduled rotations, residents will be required to complete a continuity care experience at one of the General Internal Medicine outpatient clinics or at a subspecialty clinic that aligns with the residents educational goals. All residents will participate in a minimum of one half-day clinic per week on all blocks except ICU and Internal Medicine Night block. Residents are expected to build a panel of patients to follow throughout their training. The emphasis on development of the panel should occur during the first two years of residency.
